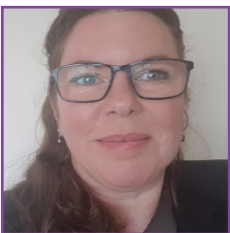


Jen Ang

*Co-founder and Director of Development and Policy,
Just Right Scotland*

Jen Ang is a Founding Director of JustRight Scotland, a human rights charity which use the law to defend and extend people's rights. She is responsible for strategy and development as well as oversight of our policy, research, communications and training. She also leads the social enterprise, JRS Knowhow.

Jen is an experienced human rights lawyer qualified to practice in Scotland, England and Wales, and New York State. She is a legal expert on asylum, human rights and children's rights, and on the rights of survivors of torture. She is also a lecturer in law with the Open University, and believes in making legal education open and accessible to all.



Maggie Brünjes

Chief Executive, Homeless Network Scotland

Maggie has been the chief executive of Homeless Network Scotland since 2010, a membership organisation that connects a wider network to learn and act on homelessness together. She has co-created several structures around homelessness and destitution, including Housing First Scotland in 2016, the UK-wide Centre for Homelessness Impact in 2018, the Everyone Home Collective in 2020 and Fair Way Scotland in 2022. Maggie was a member of the Scottish Minister appointed Homelessness and Rough Sleeping Action Group whose recommendations led to the national plan to end homelessness and sits on the Scottish Government's Homelessness Prevention and Strategy Group.



Grant Campbell

Head of Partnerships and Consulting, Homeless Network Scotland

Grant's varied career started in software, spending over 10 years working with ADOBE Systems. He took time out to study at the Open University as a mature student, finally getting the degree he never thought he could. For the last 10 years Grant has been a senior leader in the homelessness sector, firstly as CEO of Glasgow City Mission and more recently with CRISIS UK as Director of Services. He was appointed Head of Partnerships & Consulting at Homeless Network Scotland in September 2022. Grant is passionate about people, collaboration, and the great things we can achieve together – particularly ending homelessness.



Sabrina Galella

Policy & Public Affairs Officer, Just Right Scotland

Sabrina Galella is an Italian migrant and a human rights practitioner. After her degree in Politics and International Relations in London, she earned an LLM in Human Rights Law from the University of Edinburgh.

She worked as a researcher for the Scottish Parliament and then moved to lead the policy work of a youth homelessness organisation, where she worked on prevention, partnership, and capacity building. She managed a coalition of partners across sectors, provided guidance and advice to key stakeholders, and led the development of the first youth homelessness prevention pathways commissioned by the Scottish Government.

She now leads the policy and public affairs work at JustRight Scotland, where she develops and execute policy and influencing strategies across a range of human rights and equality issues.



Thomas Glen

Chief Executive, of Perth & Kinross Council

Thomas has been Chief Executive of Perth and Kinross Council since November 2021. Previous to that he worked with East Dunbartonshire Council.

Commencing as a community worker in the late 1980s, Thomas has worked across local/central government, the voluntary sector and consultancy in a career dedicated to public services.



Laura Henderson

Managing Director, Wheatley Group (East)

Laura has 19 years' experience in the housing sector and joined Wheatley Group in 2014 as a Locality Housing Director. Previously she has worked at North Ayrshire Council as an Area Housing Manager.

Laura has a professional Diploma in Housing from the De Montfort University and a Chartered Institute of Housing Level 4 in Housing. Laura was appointed as the Managing Director of Cube and Loretto Housing Association in December 2019, overseeing the new-build and investment programmes and helping customers through the challenges of the pandemic.

She took up her role as Managing Director of Wheatley Homes East and Loretto Housing in April 2022.



Richard Howat

Chief Executive, Churches Action for the Homeless

Richard started working in social care in his thirties. His first post was as Day Centre Officer in a Resource Centre. Over the next ten years he worked across a range of client groups and settings. Becoming Director of Angus Mental Health Association before taking his first steps into the homeless sector with Dundee Cyrenians.

Richard became an established figure in Dundee in homelessness, addictions and Criminal Justice sectors. A long-term advocate of service user involvement and co-production he was also active in developing social enterprise.

After nearly 20 years in Dundee he moved on to become Chief Executive of Scottish Churches Housing Action before taking up his current post as Chief Executive Officer of Churches Action for the Homeless in Perth.



Amy Hutton

Director of Services, Cyrenians

Amy joined Cyrenians in 2006, originally managing their drug and alcohol services before moving into a position within the leadership team in 2011. Amy has responsibility for the strategic management of the organisations residential services, recovery work, and interventions for people experiencing the most explicit forms of homelessness, or at vulnerable transition points such as discharge from hospital. Amy has a particular interest in developing good practice with those who experience severe and multiple disadvantage and in particular the development of holistic and relational interventions, and the expansion of evidence around this.

Having studied Community Education, Amy is passionate about the ability of the voluntary sector to engage with communities in helping the people and the environment around them; and firmly believes that the flexibility, creativity and tenacity of the voluntary sector will be crucial in tackling the problems emerging as a result of tough economic times.



Laura Keith

Support and Advice Worker, Turning Point Scotland

Laura has been working within homelessness services in Aberdeen for 12 years, and took a particular interest in supporting EEA nationals from 2018 when she was part of a pilot project commissioned by Aberdeen City Council. She began volunteering with the Citizen's Rights Project at the start of 2021, supporting EEA nationals to apply for leave to remain under the EU Settlement Scheme, and became a registered Level 1 (EU Settlement Scheme) Immigration Adviser through this role. Whilst she continues to offer monthly sessions with the Citizen's Rights Project along with two other volunteers, her main role is now as an Advice and Support Worker with Fair Way Scotland at Turning Point Scotland, where she supports EEA nationals and their family members who are destitute or at risk of destitution. Laura is also a Co-Facilitator of the No Recourse, North East Partnership.



Janine Kellett

Head of Homelessness Unit, Scottish Government

Janine Kellett is head of the homelessness unit at the Scottish Government. Her current focus is to lead delivery of the Ending Homelessness Together action plan and ensure that homelessness is prevented wherever possible and, where it does occur, housing-led solutions are provided.

Since joining the Scottish Government in 2002, Janine has worked in a wide range of policy areas including marine energy, looked after children, international trade and investment, urban regeneration and sustainable economic development. She has a PhD in French feminism from the University of Glasgow.



Ekta Marwaha

Chief Executive Officer, Refugee Sanctuary Scotland

Ekta Marwaha, Chief Executive Officer, started with the Refugee Survival Trust in April 2023. Ekta has spent most of her working career in the Third Sector, for well over 25 years and brings with her a wealth of experience in strategic planning and HR management, compliance and auditing as well as finance management and fundraising skills. Through her experience and the positions that she has held, the focus of her work has been upon promoting and advocating human right issues and equality and diversity.

Jamie McBrearty has over 25 years' experience within education, business and sport as a manager, leader and coach. Jamie's business aim to help individuals and organisations get what they want through unique coaching and mentorship programmes.

Jamie is also Academy Director at Dundee Football Club and coaches the Under 14's squad, whilst being a husband and father of 3.



Jamie McKinlay

Assistant Service Co-ordinator, Flexible Homeless Outreach Support Service Glasgow South, Turning Point Scotland

My name is Jamie, I have been employed with Turning Point Scotland TPS for just over four years. I initially gained employment as a Peer Support Practitioner through my lived experience of homelessness and mental health. During my role as Peer Support Practitioner I have been involved in many different initiatives such as “The Spirit of Christmas” this is where homeless gifts are collected from the public and distributed to children living in emergency accommodation. I was also involved in the Digital inclusion scheme where we provided electronic devices to service users living in emergency accommodation to eradicate internet poverty and social isolation. I have since moved on within the Flexible Homeless Support Service to become an Assistant Service Co-Ordinator where I am involved with the development of new support practitioners, peer support workers and students. My job role involves teaching support practitioners to deliver support to many individuals living within emergency accommodation providing guidance to navigate the homeless system and to resettle into new living environments.



Paul McLennan MSP

Minister for Housing

Paul McLennan served as a local councillor for the Dunbar and East Linton multi-member ward of East Lothian Council since 2007, and was leader of the Council from 2009 to 2012.

He has been a board member of NHS Lothian, the regional offices of Scottish Enterprise and the Commission on School Reform.

He was elected as MSP for East Lothian in 2021.



Lynne McMordie

Research Associate, I-SPHERE at Heriot-Watt University

Lynne McMordie is a Research Associate at Heriot-Watt University’s Institute for Social Policy, Housing, and Equalities Research (I-SPHERE). With a background in Northern Ireland’s voluntary and community sectors, she has been involved in developing and overseeing services to address rough sleeping, including emergency accommodation, drop-in centre, and street outreach services. Her academic work seeks to integrate her experience in frontline homelessness services with her background in social policy and housing studies. Lynne’s primary research focus revolves around homelessness and poverty, with a specific emphasis on unravelling the mechanisms of extreme social exclusion, including rough sleeping and destitution. In her ongoing research endeavours, Lynne works on the Homelessness Monitor Study, a longitudinal research program providing independent analyses of homelessness trends. This study assesses responses to economic and housing market shifts and policy changes implemented by the Westminster, Scottish, and Welsh Governments. Additionally, Lynne is engaged in the evaluation of the Fairway Scotland initiative, evaluating its effectiveness in addressing destitution and homelessness among individuals lacking access to public funds or facing restricted eligibility for statutory support.



John Mills

Head of Housing, Housing Services, Fife Council

John Mills is currently Head of Housing Services with Fife Council. His main responsibilities include the leadership and direction of Scotland's 2nd largest Local Authority Housing Service.

He is Co-Chair of the Association of Local Authority Chief Officers (ALACHO). He was a member of the Scottish Government's Homelessness & Rough Sleeping Action Group and is a member of the Scottish Government/CoSLA Homelessness Prevention Strategy Group. He was a member of the Prevention Review Group. He currently chairs the Sub-Group on RRTP's. He is a member of the Housing 2040 Board.

John is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Housing and Institute of Leadership and Management. He was Chair of the Institute of Housing in Scotland in 2005 & 2006. He is an SQA External Verifier and Qualification Development Specialist for Housing in Scotland.



Mandy Morgan

Chief Executive, Scottish Pantry Network

Mandy Morgan is a dedicated professional with a decade of experience in the housing sector. With a passion for community development and a strong background in local governance, Mandy has been a driving force in her community's growth.

Previously serving as a Local Councillor, she advocated tirelessly for her constituents' needs and was instrumental in supporting the establishment of the Ruchazie Pantry, a vital resource for the local community.

Mandy's commitment to fostering sustainable community initiatives led her to found the Scottish Pantry Network, where she currently serves as the Chief Executive. Before I started working with the Perth & Kinross Health and Social Care Partnership I managed a number of different homeless services. Maff Potts

Founder, Association of Camerados

Maff went from having his own challenges with mental health and homelessness to running the largest homeless provider in the UK, as Director of Homelessness Services at the Salvation Army. He has spent 20 years working and volunteering in the social justice sector, including transforming the Millennium Dome into a homeless shelter as head of Crisis at Christmas, working as a government advisor - heading up the “Places of Change” programme and rewriting the UK government’s policy for homeless centres - and overseeing the funding of £170 million worth of homeless projects.

Having been instrumental in creating culture change in national homelessness policymaking, Maff has come to believe that the biggest impacts come from people looking out for each other. Everyone has tough times and Maff knows, based on his professional and personal experience, that long term change comes from people coming together without trying to fix each other or trying to solve each other’s problems. The key is to just be a bit more human.

Maff founded the social movement Camerados in 2015. Camerados believe that the answer to our problems is each other and they can be found setting up Public Living Rooms - places where people going through tough times can get together and look out for each other. There are Public Living Rooms in hospitals, libraries, schools and other locations in the UK and beyond. Anyone can be a camerado, whether they are connected to a Public Living Room or not, all that is asked is that they try to follow these [six simple ideas](https://camerados.org/what-is-camerados). Director, Shelter Scotland

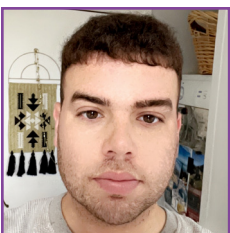
Alison became Director of Shelter Scotland in June 2020, having previously been Deputy Director, with responsibility for the leadership and development of all of the organisation's services across Scotland and for all aspects of volunteering and involvement. Alison joined Shelter Scotland in 2002, with extensive leadership experience in health and social care, mostly in the Third Sector, but also within local authorities and the NHS. Immediately prior to joining Shelter Scotland, Alison worked in the mental health field, where she played a leading role in the development of several innovative services, as well as making a major contribution to pioneering the involvement of people who experience mental health issues in the design, delivery and management of services. Alison began her career in the late 1980s, working in a large hostel for men who had long-term experience of homelessness. Since becoming Director, Alison has been prioritising strengthening housing rights and securing a long-term commitment to increasing social housing.

Dr Beth Watts-Cobbe is a Senior Research Fellow and Deputy Director at the Institute for Social Policy, Housing and Equalities Research (I-SPHERE), Heriot-Watt University. Beth's is an applied social scientist whose research focuses on homelessness, housing, poverty and broader questions about the design, effectiveness and ethical legitimacy of social and welfare policies. She currently leads the 2021-26 Crisis-funded Homelessness Monitors project tracking the impacts of economic and policy change on homelessness across Great Britain and the Joseph Rowntree Foundation-funded evaluation of Fair Way Scotland, a partnership to prevent homelessness and destitution among those with No Recourse to Public Funds in Scotland. Other research has focused on temporary and emergency accommodation responses to homelessness in global and UK cities, homelessness prevention, youth homelessness and behavioural conditionality. She is a current trustee for the estrangement charity Stand Alone, former trustee of the youth homelessness charity the Rock Trust, an editor of the international journal Housing Studies and former chair of the Housing Studies Association.



Jeremy Wylie
