





#### **Session Outline**

Fixed mindset is the belief that we're born with a fixed level of natural ability, intelligence or talent. *Growth mindset* is the belief that our level of success is determined by factors such as effort, application and skills development. ### Rapid Rehousing - making it work

#### **Session Outline**

'Home First' in Perth & Kinross is the only example of a fully developed, rapid rehousing model being delivered in Scotland. The innovative approach was formally launched in 2017 – preceding the national policy objective and inspiring the cornerstone recommendation from the Homelessness & Rough Sleeping Action Group that led to the joint Scottish Government-COSLA Ending Homelessness Together Plan and to each council area now having a Rapid Rehousing Transition Plan in place.

This breakout session will chart the council's improvement journey that began in 2008, from a lowest possible regulation grading, to a period of transformational change, to breakthrough results on homelessness. And explore with delegates the big questions to make rapid rehousing work in every council area in Scotland.

### Everyone's WISH

#### **Session Outline**

The pioneering Women in Safe Homes (WISH) fund was created by UK social impact and investment organisations in response to the need for safe, decent housing for women who are more likely to experience homelessness as a result of living in an abusive household. Earlier this year, Cyrenians announced it will be the first charity partner in Scotland to buy and refurbish properties to create safe homes for women who have experienced domestic abuse.

This breakout session will brief on the scale and nature of women's homelessness in Scotland and the policy landscape intended to tackle it. And explore the aspirations of this new Cyrenians partnership to help inform and inspire similar partnerships in your area.

# Can Scotland mitigate the impact of UK Immigration Policy?

#### **Session Outline**

Immigration is an issue that divides opinion across politics and society, with the mood intensifying as a result of world events. Yet at the very heart of this issue are people seeking sanctuary or to settle in Scotland, some of whom become homeless and destitute because they have no recourse to public funds. Can Scotland mitigate the impact of this UK policy and in light of the Illegal Migration Act? What can be achieved if lots of us do a little more?

This breakout session will brief on immigration policy and share learning from the first-year evaluation of Fair Way Scotland – what worked and what didn't. And explore together what each of us, in all our different roles and sectors, can do to protect people from homelessness, destitution and other harms.



# A message from our partner **Wheatley Group**

Wheatley Group is delighted to support Homeless Network Scotland's Annual Homelessness Conference.

As Scotland's largest housing, care, and property-management group, our mission is 'Making Homes and Lives Better' for our 210,000 customers in 19 local authority areas across Scotland.

As we find ourselves amid a cost-of-living crisis, times are undoubtedly challenging for tenants across the country.

With ever-increasing pressure on local housing systems, Wheatley has a key role to play in working with public and private partners to tackle homelessness and help people into their own home.

Protecting the most vulnerable people in our communities is, and will always be, a priority at Wheatley.

Wheatley continues to work extensively with Scottish Government, local authority partners, and other agencies to help tackle homelessness from every angle. One way is through the Housing First initiative. It is a multi-agency partnership that provides homeless people with a tenancy and the support they need to build their lives.

Wheatley has also:

- allocated over 7,000 homes to homeless people in the last three years;
- created over 340 Housing First tenancies;
- 'flipped' 270 temporary furnished homes, turning them into permanent homes for the homeless people living in them;
- and provided over 1600 homes to refugees, including 223 homes to local authority partners to house Ukrainian families.

Last August, Wheatley also launched our 'Here for You' campaign to support 20,000 tenants during the cost-of-living crisis.

The campaign supports tenants of Wheatley's Registered Social Landlords – Wheatley Homes Glasgow, Wheatley Homes East, Wheatley Homes South, Loretto, and tenants of Lowther Homes.

It further strengthened the wraparound support programmes we already have in place to help customers, with a focus on offering expert support and financial support at the point of crisis.

In the last year alone, our welfare benefits advisors supported 7386 people and helped them claim back more than £13 million in benefits and tax credits they were due. EatWell, our emergency food service, helped 4418 households in the last year by distributing 6186 supermarket vouchers.

Of course, a true measure of success should not be judged solely in terms of numbers and percentages. Instead, we need to listen carefully to what our customers have to say.

William, 69, from Glasgow, was formerly homeless before receiving the keys to his new home, and additional support, from Wheatley.

William said: "I spent years living on the streets before finally getting the support I needed to change my path.

"I reached my lowest point after attempting suicide and almost losing my life. I'm one of the lucky ones and I now have my own home to call my own — a far cry from where I was a few years ago.

"I went from having nothing to having the keys to a house. A roof over my head. The support I received from my Wheatley housing officers changed all that for me. I now have a life I never dreamed I could."
